Course Description:

First course of 2-semester capstone sequence. Students work on design problems that have a humanitarian focus. Emphasis on problem definition, requirements, and design proposal.

- Student will understand design as a process.
- Students will apply core engineering skills to the design process.

- Students will appreciate design as a process for taking an idea or need from concept to realization of a deliverable (component, system, process).
- Students develop key professional and project management related skills and understand their relationship to the design process.
- Students appreciate design as the culminating ability and skill arising from their studies.

- Definition of problem and design specifications for humanitarian projects
- Professional codes and standards applicable to design problems defined
- Analysis of literature germane to topics chosen
- Breaking design down into manageable subsystems
- Report requirements and general communications
- Topics specific to humanitarian projects
